

Curriculum Delivery Policy

Rationale:

Student learning is the core focus of Maungaraki School. A teaching and learning programme that meets individual student needs and reflects the New Zealand Curriculum is essential to maximize student learning and enable students and staff to aspire to excellence.

Delivery of the curriculum will foster student progress and achievement, meet all legislative requirements from the Ministry of Education and board of trustees.

Therefore the Principal shall not fail to:

1. Provide opportunities for all students in years to achieve success in all essential Learning Areas and key competencies of the New Zealand Curriculum and the Maungaraki School charter.
2. Through a range of assessment practices, report on progress and achievement of all students including information in relation to National Standards as per the board's three year review cycle.
3. Implement teaching and learning programmes that support the Ministry priority groups. Ensuring reporting on those groups to the Board of Trustees
4. Consult with the school's Māori community about the policies / plans for improving the achievement of Māori students.
5. Provide professional development opportunities to maintain a sound foundation for curriculum delivery.
6. Ensure that the school resource materials are maintained at an adequate level.
7. Provide appropriate career education and guidance for year 7 and 8 students.
8. Provide alternative language tuition for Year 7 and 8 students.
9. Seek board approval before changes to the school curriculum requiring increased expenditure or significant changes to programmes or staffing are made.
10. Ensure achievement of the Charter aims and targets.
